In 2023, Rainbow Days achieved a milestone by serving over 15,000 children and youth in the Dallas community alone. We also replicated our impact nationally by training in over 18 states so teams around the U.S. could provide Rainbow Days CBSG® Program to children and youth in their own communities.

As I reflect on the opportunities and challenges we experienced in 2023, the word that comes to mind is **relationships**. In our business, relationships are critical. They are an **essential part of who we are** as an organization, how we accomplish our mission, navigate obstacles, win new opportunities, and achieve success.

In fact, relationships are one of our Organizational Core Values, which states:

"We value relationships as we intentionally develop meaningful and enduring connections with our participants, partners, and supporters."

The first significant relationship we forge is with counselors, principals, case managers, and contacts at our school, shelter, district, and community-based sites. These **65+ partners** are critical to opening doors and paving the way to make it possible to serve children and youth right where they are or to train others so they can work with children and youth in their own communities. Often, these relationships develop into friendships and become like an extended family to our staff, who have worked with many of the same school counselors, nonprofit staff, and shelter staff for **decades**.

The second essential priority relationship we develop is with the **children and youth** we serve. First, our team shows how much they care, and then they impart knowledge and skills. Theodore Roosevelt aptly says, "**No one cares how much you know until they know how much you care**." After staff builds these caring relationships, the lessons can be learned, social norms challenged, hard questions wrestled with, and support can be given, so life change can begin to happen.

What fuels both of these relationships and makes our impact possible are our relationships with generous donors, supporters, and volunteers **like you**. With 65% of our organization's revenue coming from private donations, your gifts to Rainbow Days are vitally important and make a meaningful and profound impact on our organization and those we serve.

CBSG® Program

Rainbow Days developed the **CBSG® Program** to provide social emotional support, skill building and practice for children and youth in a peer-to-peer support group setting. All support groups are led by trained facilitators, who serve as positive mentors and allow children to share their feelings in a safe space.

Supportive Services

Rainbow Days offers a **host of services**, events and activities that complement our support groups and the core messages we teach:

- Classroom presentations
- Summer day camps
- Family outings
- Positive mentored activities
- After-school support
- Tangible items to meet basic needs

Training

To broaden our reach, Rainbow Days leads a **nationally recognized training program** that equips teachers, counselors and volunteers with our curricula and best practices.

- Includes CBSG® Program, prevention workshops and nonprofit workforce development.
- Fulfills professional education (CPE/CEU) requirements for various roles.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



Kids' University is an educational camp experience for homeless children and youth in partnership with The University of Texas at Dallas. This year, **130 children and youth** participated in fun interactive STEM, art, dance, and financial literacy classes while exploring future career options.



Behavioral Health Promotion Presentations promoted positive behavioral health choices, goal setting, decision-making, and alcohol and drug prevention. Our staff delivered **464 presentations** at schools and community centers.





Camp Bravo! is a performing and visual arts camp where children residing in local shelters participated in classes on music, dance, acting, drumming, and various artistic expressions. This year, 161 children and youth shined brightly on stage, performing "Broadway in Revue" in front of a live audience.



Mental Health Resource Fairs – Our Community Connection team launched Mental Health Resource Fairs at Middle and High School Campuses, with interactive stations focused on stress management, mindfulness, healthy ways to deal with complex feelings, building self-esteem, and more.

The Back-to-School Celebration, hosted at Dallas Market Center, provided over **1,000 at-risk and homeless children** with backpacks, school supplies, uniforms and other resources to start school prepared for success.

Saturday with Santa spread holiday joy to **700 children and families** experiencing homelessness by giving out stockings filled with toys, treats and essential tangible items.



Outdoor Adventure Camp exposed over 150 children and youth residing in shelters to a traditional outdoor summer camp experience, including swimming, fishing, horseback riding, and archery. These adventures fostered teamwork while exposing children to nature, physical exercise, and a love of the outdoors.



Red Ribbon Week Presentations – To celebrate National Red Ribbon Week in October, we promoted the value and importance of living a drug-free life through presentations to 6,077 students at ten different schools and community-based sites throughout Dallas.

In 2023 Rainbow Days expanded its impact through **training services** making a difference in children's lives throughout Texas and around the nation. **From coast to coast**, Washington to Florida, New Mexico to New Jersey, the CBSG Program has a lasting impact on children and youth nationwide.

CBSG® OUTCOMES

At the heart of Rainbow Days is the unique **Curriculum-Based Support Group (CBSG®) Program.** Developed **40 years ago**, Rainbow Days have now updated, edited and published its 11th edition of the CBSG Program in 2022. As today's youth continue to experience mental health challenges at a staggering rate, the CBSG® Program and the messages that it teaches remain **timeless**, more relevant, important, and needed now than ever.

The CBSG® Program supports, strengthens, and improves the **social, emotional and behavioral health and well-being** of children/youth. Through the CBSG® Program, Rainbow Days fosters and improves children's resiliency and protective factors, teaches healthy coping and self-management skills, promotes positive pro-social behaviors, and prevents substance use and misuse.



Each year, thousands of children and youth in the Dallas community benefit from participating in a CBSG led by Rainbow Days trained and caring direct service staff. Additionally, thousands more children benefit throughout Texas and the U.S. as we train hundreds of school counselors, nonprofit staff and other youth-serving professionals each year in how to implement the CBSG® Program with children in their own community.

Based on Resiliency & Protective Factor research and Social Emotional Learning **(SEL) principles**, The CBSG® Program teaches children/youth valuable lessons on Self-Awareness, Social Awareness & Competence, Relationship Skills, Responsible Decision Making and instills a Sense of Purpose & Future. During support group, children participate in a guided discussion, engage in experiential learning activities and build trust with their peers and caring adult facilitators.

The CBSG® Program is research and evidence-based and has been recognized by the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention as a proven and effective program. After completing the CBSG® Program, children and youth demonstrate an **INCREASE** in the following outcomes:

- Perceived well-being
- Understanding of feelings and how to express feelings in healthy ways
- Sense of **hope** and purpose for the future
- Knowledge and ability to make **healthy choices**
- Sense of belonging with others and social connectedness
- Ability to identify safe people to ask for help
- Non-use attitude toward alcohol, tobacco and other drugs
- Positive, pro-social attitudes, behaviors and intentions

Additionally, for nearly two decades, the CBSG® Program has undergone multiple rigorous evaluation studies and reviews, which show that the program reduces isolation and increases hope, optimism and personal resiliency. An independent control group study by researchers at UT Southwestern found that children participating in the program demonstrate the following positive outcomes:


- 90 percent of children improve their social-emotional competencies
- **91 percent** increase their understanding of and commitment to healthy choices, including adopting a non-use attitude toward alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.




<u>Curriculum-Based Support Group</u> (CBSG®) Program Facilitator Training

Through partnerships with **65+ different service sites** in 2023, Rainbow Days' dedicated, caring staff members were able to bring our programs to thousands of local kids. This year's partners included: elementary, middle and high schools in five school districts; recreation and community centers; alternative schools; homeless and domestic violence shelters; motels; supportive housing sites; and other transitional living centers.

<u>Hannah's Story</u>

Rainbow Days curriculum teaches children a basic set of life skills and how to make **healthy choices**, **set goals** for the future, **handle anger**, and **cope** with difficult situations. **Hannah** is a remarkable young woman whose story captures everything that Rainbow Days hopes to teach children. Please read about her story below.

"I started being involved in Rainbow Days when I was in **sixth grade**. Where I am from, as soon as you walk out of your house, you are offered drugs. It is that accessible to us.

I came from **an abused home**. My mom is an alcoholic, and my brother is a drug addict. I felt helpless because I could not help my mom or brother escape that situation. I had absolutely **no support**, and I could not depend on anyone in my life.

Accepting that this was my life's reality was hard, but making a **change was ten times harder**.

Rainbow Days' mentors showed they **truly cared** about me. A lot of kids do not have that support from adults. I could **express myself** with them without being judged, which is what meant the most to me.

Miss K and Miss Shamila were everything to me. Their support helped me get through everything that I was going through. Even when I did not believe in myself or that I could be something in life, they saw it in me, and that is what is **pushing me**.

There were times when I was worried I would not be alive the next day, but they saw that I could do it. They pushed me to be who I am today. They pushed me to believe in myself. They gave me the courage to stand up. I completely transformed.

I will be the first person in my family to **graduate from high school and college**. After that, I plan to become a **police officer**.

I see so many kids struggling, and I know what they are going through. I know these kids have the potential

to do something great. It is up to us to be the support for other people. I hope to help kids in the future just like how Miss K and Miss Shamila helped me.

Even if it is just one day,
you can make a huge difference.

That is what Rainbow Days does."

We know that Hannah's strength, intelligence, determination, and empathy will take her wherever she wants to go in life, and Rainbow Days is immensely **proud** to be a part of her story.



<u>The Life Change Within</u> <u>Rainbow Days Support Groups.</u>

Ray Riley, a new **Behavioral Health Specialist** who leads Curriculum Based Support Groups in shelters across Dallas and Collin County, shares his thoughts on Rainbow Days' impact.

"Working with Rainbow Days has been an **eye-opening experience**, unlike anything I have experienced before. I firmly believe that the lives and futures of the children and families served by Rainbow Days are permanently and **positively changed**.

I connect with all of the children in my groups, but one participant has made a significant impression on me this school year. **Brooke** is a well-mannered and exceptionally kind twelve-year-old young lady. Brooke has a younger sister, Charlie, who also attends my group sessions.

When we first started our group sessions in August, Brooke was reluctant to participate and often hid underneath her black hoodie. She rarely made eye contact and kept her head down, but I could tell there was much more to this young girl.

Her face was filled with disappointment about whatever problems she was facing at home or mental struggles that weighed on her mind. Yet, every day that I saw Brooke and Charlie, Brooke always kept an eye out for her little sister. Charlie frequently looked to Brooke for guidance and approving glances as she wondered what to do or say. Brooke was consistently patient and kind with all members of our group. Brooke shared with me one day that the well-being of her sister was what she cared about most in life. I thought this was such a profound and endearing thing to say, especially coming from a twelve-year-old.

I made it a top priority to check in on Brooke and thoroughly engage in any topic she was interested in during our sessions. I make it evident to all my kids that I care about them, and that I am a safe person. I never push on anything they might not want to discuss, but I make it clear that my door is always open.

I noticed throughout the semester that Brooke started to consistently volunteer to help pass out supplies during group, assist other children with our activities, and take the lead during our conversations. She

started to abandon the guards she put up and share her feelings with our group topics.

I had the privilege to witness firsthand the life change that happens when children are in Rainbow Days weekly support groups. I have no doubt that Brooke will succeed with whatever she pursues in life. I am so proud of Brooke for committing to grow. I am also very proud to be a part of Rainbow Days and the positive change that we are making daily in children's lives.

Seeing this change makes it easy to be a huge cheerleader for the work that Rainbow Days does."

Guests enjoyed an engaging keynote address from **Coach Ken Carter**. Coach Ken Carter brought high energy to the luncheon with a message about determination, success, and giving back to the community. Coach Ken Carter is a successful author, speaker, and philanthropist who spreads his message of teamwork, accountability, and leadership. Coach's tough love and mentorship have helped students, such as "Cruz," from his namesake hit movie "Coach Carter," who is now a top medical professional.





Demographics of the children, youth and parents Rainbow Days serves.


Race / Ethnicity



<u>Age Range</u>




<u>Gender</u>




